IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

According to the <u>Illinois State Board of Education</u>, the State Seal of Biliteracy "recognizes public high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English." Through HB 4330, the Illinois School Code was amended to include the Seal of Biliteracy. <u>Illinois Student Code</u> requires that public universities in the State of Illinois (1) for admissions purposes, accept the State Seal of Biliteracy as equivalent to two years of foreign language coursework taken in high school and (2) establish criteria for awarding equivalent course credit. These requirements went into effect January 1, 2017.

Credit is not processed automatically upon receipt of a high school transcript. In accordance with Illinois School Code, students enrolled in a public community college or public university who have received a State Seal of Biliteracy must request credit for their seal within 3 academic years after graduating from high school. Students enrolled at the University of Illinois at Urbana–Champaign may submit the request to the Office of the Registrar via the online request form after the beginning of the first term of enrollment.
