American History: Discovery to Present

The compelling question and course goal of this class is; *How does the past help us understand the present*? In order to explore this question this class will look at American History thematically. In other words, instead of starting at the very beginning of American History and finishing with the most recent events in our history, we will look at U.S. history from the perspective of five different sets of smaller focus questions:

Unit 1: American Foundations, Rebellion, and Civil War: *How do foundational events help us understand present issues?*

Unit 2: Civil Rights: Why does social change happen?

Unit 3: Immigration: To what extent has the American Dream been an achievable reality?

Unit 4: Boom and Bust: To what extent has the American Dream been an achievable reality?

Unit 5: Friends, Foes, and Fanatics: Does might make right?

Attendance:

Class Participation:

This will be an interactive class and will include simulations, discussions, and activities. Therefore, your participation is crucial if you want to be successful and if you want the class to be enjoyable. Participation will compose **20%** of your grade.

Assessments:

From time to time I will provide you with an assessment of your knowledge of the material we have covered during a particular unit. It might consist of a multiple choice exam, essay, Socratic seminar or a project. If you come to class, do your work, and review a bit, these assessments will be no problem and should be an enjoyable experience for all involved. Assessments will compose **80%** of your grade.

My grading system is very simple: 80% Assessments and 20% Participation.
